### PAINTWORK CONTAMINATION

## DUE TO THE USE OF UNSUITABLE CAR COVERS.

#### ALL MODELS

If plastic or rubber car covers (portable garages) are employed as a weather protection, they may give rise to serious paintwork deterioration, and although these covers are not quite as popular now as in the past, we feel we should draw your attention once again to the dangers consequent upon indiscriminate use.

In addition to the more obvious question of paintwork damage that arise from abrasion or bad ventilation, we would remind you that certain covers in the rubber and P.V.C. plastics classes can cause serious discoloration or paint film softening if they are allowed to contact the paintwork.

If your customer wishes to have your advice in connection with the use of car covers, we recommend you ensure that such covers have a cloth or polythene barrier between the cover and the paint film and are adequately ventilated.

Will you please bring this to the attention of all concerned.
